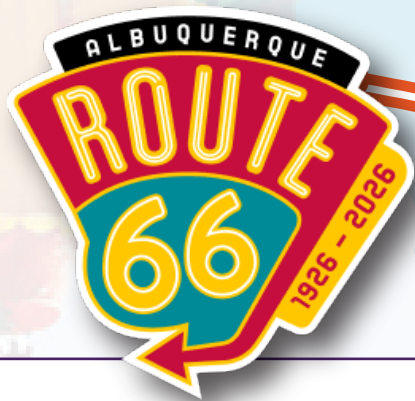

A HISTORIC HIGHWAY FOR MODERN MEETINGS

As Route 66 turns 100, there's no better place than Albuquerque to anchor business events in the rich culture, neon colors and creative spirit of this enduring slice of Americana.



Albuquerque boasts the longest intact urban stretch of [Route 66](#) in a single city, spanning 18 miles east to west through the city as Central Avenue.

Albuquerque is the only place along Route 66 where the historic highway crosses itself.



Along Albuquerque's stretch of Route 66, classic motels have also found new life through renovation.

Among these is the memorable [El Vado](#), opened in 1937 and lovingly restored with event space.



The City of Albuquerque has announced [Route 66 Remixed](#), an innovative public art project that transforms Route 66 into an art-fueled road trip through the city that includes 18 immersive installations.



Downtown's [ARRIVE Albuquerque](#) is a renovated historic hotel. Originally built in 1965 and opened as Downtowner Motor Inn, this 137-room boutique property is a stylish, design-forward hotel that both embraces the present and nods to the past.
